### SECTION 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

### SECTION 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

### SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

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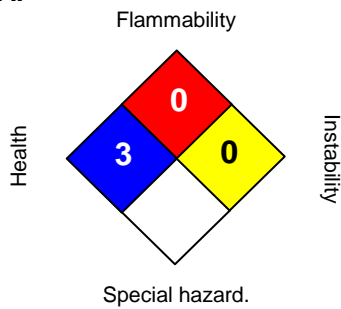
